

Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions

The MSCA Seal of Excellence

- Quality abel awarded to high-quality project proposals (evaluation of above to 85%) which could not be funded due to budget constraints
- Helps researchers secure funding from other funding bodies, taking advantage of the EU evaluation process
- Helps increase participation and overall success rates
- Increases the attractiveness of hosting countries, regions and institutions, particularly widening countries (currently 8 out of the 15 countries with support schemes in place)
- Over **11,900 Seals of Excellence** awarded under Horizon 2020





The MSCA SoE under Horizon Europe

- Seal of Seal lence awarded for MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships and COFUND
- Same evaluation score threshold: proposals with a score equal or above 85%, but which could not be funded
- **3,584 Seals of Excellence** awarded under HE (2021 and 2022 PF calls as well as 2021 COFUND calls)
- Next Seals of Excellence to be awarded in December for COFUND 2022 call





• From five (CY, CZ, IT, SE, SI) to **15 countries**

- If new schemes announced over the past year: nine for Postdoctoral Fellowships (AT, SK, RO, IT, SI, ES, two in FR, DE); and two COFUND schemes (SI, CZ)
- From 127 total supported researchers in 2017 to at least **1,137 in 2023**







Number of countries with support schemes

- New schemes recently launched in the context of national Recovery and Resilience Facility (RFF) plans: RO, IT, ES, SI, LT
- Similar initiative expected in SK this year



 Funding awarded to MSCA Seal of Excellence projects under both Horizon 2020 and Horizon Europe covered by EU 2021/1237-GBER (art. 25b) and therefore exempted from notification requirement
